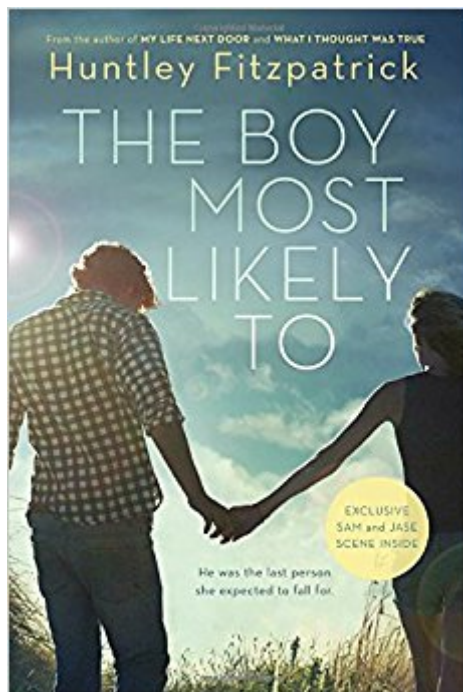

Gr 9 Up—While readers met Alice Garrett and Tim Mason in *My Life Next Door* (Dial, 2012), that novel centered on Jase Garrett and Samantha Reed. This time, the focus shifts to Alice and Tim. Tim continues to attend Alcoholics Anonymous, while Alice still tries not to fall for him because of his checkered lifestyle. As he struggles to keep his life together, he has every reason to fall off the wagon when Hester, a girl from his past, reenters his life with a son she claims is his. Tim is forced to grow up in a hurry and figure out what is the right thing to do. The relationship between Alice and Tim blossoms as Tim's true character is revealed. This novel will speak to any teen who has ever

had to make a hard decision. The author delivers a strong message without being heavy-handed, and the well-thought-out ending is considerate and will broaden teens' perspectives. From page one, Huntley Fitzpatrick throws the reader into Tim's emotional turmoil, which made me feel completely invested in him! Then there's Alice. She is compassionate and fiercely loyal to the ones she loves. Readers will admire her for it. Her attraction to Tim, her struggle to let him into her heart is so authentic, that I found myself aching for her, for them. The blend of raw, realistic situations with the power that love has to heal, is a GIFT for readers! This novel is emotionally raw, is beautifully written, is revealing of characters' deepest flaws and greatest strengths, is vivid in its setting, is a window into the dark side of alcoholism and the struggle for sobriety, shows that binge drinking can lead to dire consequences and can indeed make you an alcoholic, proves family doesn't

Heart. This novel is IMPORTANT! I hope schools will embrace it as part of their DARE program. It's eye-opening and painful and heartbreaking and definitely swoony!

One of the most solid writers in this genre, that I've come across. The story is satisfying with a good character "journey". I enjoy Tim's self-deprecating humor and honesty about his choices and their consequences. His struggles with addiction are somewhat realistic, if far too easily resolved. But this is a light story and so doesn't dig too deeply into its heavier themes. I do find it jarring that no one who knows TIM questions the situation he is in with regard to responsibility for the safety and well-being of another human, and I'll leave it at that, to avoid spoilers...but seriously, why is there no oversight involved? Several adults fail to question the advisability of what Tim is left to cope with, in any serious way that engages the safety of Cal. I loved watching Tim develop that relationship, and I loved that the issue of responsibility and relationship in that situation was addressed from the other

side of the gender line. But I'd hate to think that any teen readers (are these actually read by teens?) might come away with the impression that it's that idyllic or easy. Also, the supposedly 17 and 19 year main characters act like they're at least twenty five, developmentally. Tim might be thirty, and just beginning to pull his head out of his...in the way that a lot of males do around that age. Not 17. Nevertheless, the writing is so good that I was willing to talk myself out of disbelief and just enjoy the ride. Definitely recommend as a diversion, if not a picture of actual life.

I loved EVERYTHING about this book. If you're a regular reader of my blog or Twitter feed then you probably know by now that I'm a HUGE, SUPER, MEGA-FAN of Huntley Fitzpatrick. As in, she is one of my most favorite authors EVAR! So, naturally, when I heard that a companion novel to *My Life Next Door* was in the works, I immediately started making unintelligible high-pitched noises that could only be described as sounds of pure glee! My suspicions were confirmed in one of my favorite scenes from *My Life Next Door*, in which he shows just how tender and sweet he can be. I knew from that moment that I NEEDED a Tim book in my life.

I'm so happy to tell you dear readers, that *The Boy Most Likely To* is the Tim book you've been desperate for. Everything about his story is touching, raw and emotional. It's heart-breaking and heart-mending all at once. Fitzpatrick is a master at creating characters that are so real and relatable, and in Tim we find a deeply flawed, but also a deeply loveable character. His journey throughout this book is nothing short of amazing and the perfect little moments mixed with the overwhelming big moments complemented each other and created a perfectly balanced story of self-discovery and self-acceptance. Tim faces a pretty life-changing event at towards the beginning of this book, and the way in which he processes and alters his way of life for this change made me love him even more. In this book, Tim becomes a man. All of these words of love for this book, and I haven't even mentioned Alice Garrett?! She's another character I

adored from *My Life Next Door*, and her sassiness and strength are further explored in this book. What she brings to Tim's life, and vice-versa, are really what *The Boy Most Likely To* is all about. The power that comes from knowing you have your "person" in life. Someone who accepts you, but pushes you to be a better person. Who understands you, yet challenges your way of thinking. Tim and Alice face some serious odds, but the way in which they grow from being in another's life is ultimately what makes them stronger as

individuals. Let's not forget about the Garrett family as a whole. What you loved so much about them in *My Life Next Door* is back and better than ever in Tim's story, and I just couldn't get enough of their family dynamic in all of its perfection. Pasty, George, Harry, Duff..and the entire Garret crew absolutely make my heart melt, and I was so thrilled to get another heaping dose of their perfect little ball of chaos.
