


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Ingenue In White: Reflections Of A Costume Designer (Art Of Theater Series)

For sixteen years she was a costume designer for the Actors Theatre of Louisville where she designed over eighty productions, including thirty for The Humana Festival of New American Plays. She has designed costumes for The Guthrie, Long Wharf Theatre, The Hartford Stage Company, Manhattan Theatre Club, Circle in the Square, The Opera Company of Boston, Spoleto USA, Dublin Theatre Festival, and The Festival of Perth. She was a resident costume designer at Harvard University and has taught costume design at Tufts University, The University of Massachusetts at Amherst, Bennington College, and Smith

College. She is a graduate of Wellesley College and NYU School of the Arts.
