

Jack London, whose real name was John Griffith Chaney, was born 12th January 1876 in San Francisco, America. A resounding theme in his literary work was one of a struggle to survive. London's upbringing and his experiences in later life would serve as the grounding for his unique style of writing. Although deserted by his father, London was raised by his spiritualist mother who was known for her eccentricity. By the age of 14, London was developing a taste for adventure and he left school to work for a government fish patrol. He would later join the navy, and would explore most of America by travelling as a hobo on freight trains. In 1897 Jack London travelled to the Klondike hoping to strike it rich in America's last gold rush. While he did not find gold in the harsh arctic wilderness, London did discover a wealth of material he would later fashion into two of his best known novels, *Call of the Wild* and *White Fang*. Published in 1903, *Call of the Wild* benefited from the rise of the modern press and publishing industry, becoming immensely popular and launching London's career. Over the following years London wrote prolifically, drawing again on his Klondike adventure for *White Fang* and his experiences at sea as a young man for *The Sea Wolf*. London died on 22nd November 1916.

This is a thin book and on 68 pages. It would be best called a comic book version of *Call of the Wild*. My children really like Raina Telgemeier's graphic novels and I was hoping to get them some classic books similar to hers but this is thin, and the font does not fit in well with the drawing. Not to belittle what I am sure was a sincere effort, but it comes off as amateurish. It was okay but I would have not bought it had I seen it in person first. I would rank higher if it was clearly stated that it is a much more like a comic book than a graphic novel.

I had to read this back in seventh grade and I enjoyed it but the graphic novel held my son's interest better.

Where are these guys getting their artists? What great graphics. A pleasure to read to my child.

Getting young readers up to speed on the classics is difficult so this is an easy choice to encourage reading. I provided 5 different stories for my grandsons and asked that they be returned to me when finished as the illustrations are lovely and I want to enjoy them too. The comic book classics are a great vehicle to quickly promote conversations about literature and possibly plant a seed for young people to enjoy the classics when they are more mature.
