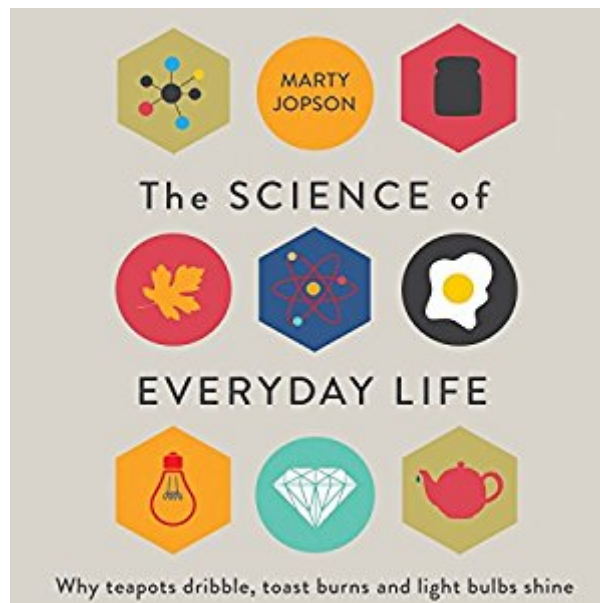

Great book, a witty, well-explained 'how things work', a pleasure to read, breathing the author's desire to ask questions about the World around him on every page. The precise description about how candles work is amazing, as why autumn trees go from green to yellow or red. The author even bothers to include units such as miles, inches and what-have-you used in less scientifically developed countries- very inclusive. I spotted just one error: "Light with wavelengths just shorter than the colour red make up what is known as infrared light."

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
