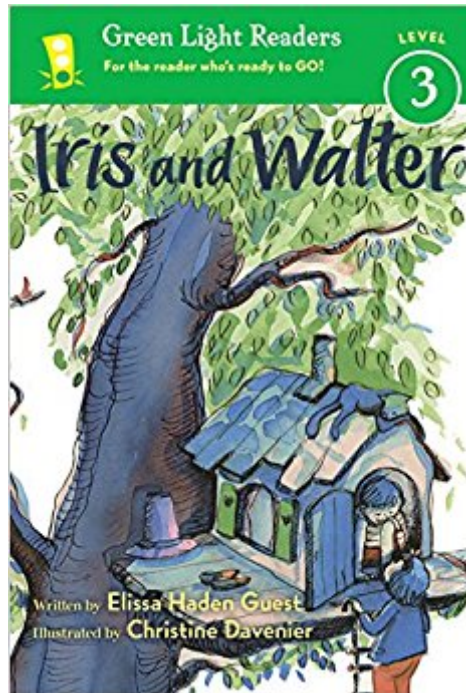

Kindergarten-Grade 2-In this beginning chapter book, Iris has moved from the city to the country, and she is not impressed. There are no noises, no stoops to sit on, and seemingly, no children. Her parents encourage her to play in her new yard to no avail; it is her grandfather who finally takes her for a walk and she meets Walter in his tree house. The two become fast friends and Iris learns to appreciate country life. She rides the boy's pony, plays hide-and-seek, and rolls in the grass. The only flaw in the story is that when her pal asks her about life in the big city, all she has to say is,

"there are lots and lots and lots of people." Walter replies that in the country "there are lots and lots and lots of stars," and the discussion abruptly ends there. The exchange seems stilted and preachy, and Walter appears to be either very wise or very boring. The pen-and-ink illustrations are a bit sloppy and have a limited palette of primarily greens, blues, and pinks. Overall, though, the story does work, showing the positive qualities of different lifestyles and that friends can be found anywhere. This collection of four early-reader stories is warm and sweet. When Iris's family moves from the big city to the country, Iris is sad. She misses the noise and bustle of the city. There is nothing to do in the country. Her parents tell her to "cheer up," but Iris can't. And maybe doesn't want to. Then Grandpa takes Iris for a walk and they explore the country. What Iris really wants is to find another kid. Amazingly (or did Grandpa have it planned all along?) she does. His name is Walter. The two become friends and Iris learns that there are wonderful things to do in the countryside, too.

Great book for a 1st-2nd grader!
