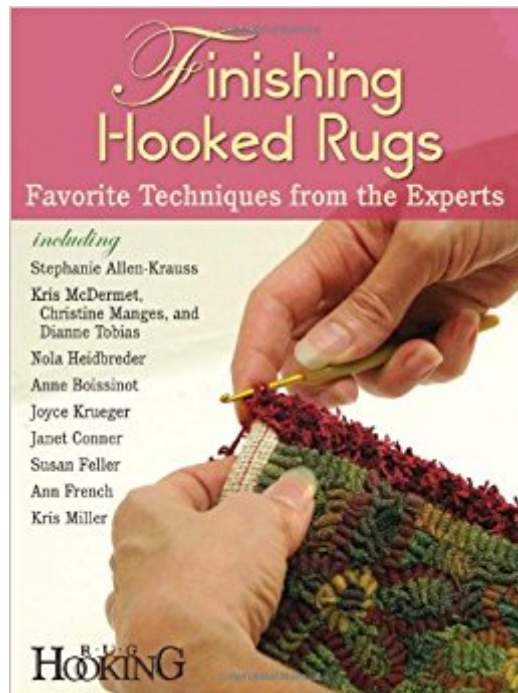

I got this book to get a better handle on how to finish hooked rugs with crochet, as this is even shown on the book cover, but the photos are not clear at all. No step by step photos even show where the crochet hook is inserted to do the stitches....it's presented as if the crochet edge appears magically with a crochet hook attached to one bit. Not useful at ALL. I crochet well....I'll just have to make it up myself but this book is not helping. Perhaps it does a better job with other finishing techniques but the crochet option was really the only one I'm interested in.

I would highly recommend this book for learning how to finish your rugs or to keep on hand as a reference. The pictures are so helpful! I took this to a local office supply store and had it spiral bound. I am now able to keep the book open to the page I need to look at as I finished my rug. Every rug hooker should have this book in their library. Keep calm and hook on!

This book is a **MUST** resource for rug hookers. While there are books that cover some of the basics techniques for finishing rugs, this book has everything you need. The instructions and pictures are excellent and are the result of a collaboration of teachers from across the United States.
