Very repetitive, poor grammar, uncalled for insults to hipsters which strikes me as just plain weird. Book could have been written in about 40 pages tops.

Based on some of the earlier reviews here, I was expecting to read a book that was revolutionary in the way it presented the philosophy of Luciferianism. What I found instead was a book rife with spelling errors, punctuation and grammar mistakes along with a "philosophy" that is nothing new if you've read the likes of Crowley, Spare, etc. I got a little over halfway through the book (in one sitting) before I decided I just couldn't take it anymore. I couldn't believe that an organization (the GCOL) that is trying to be taken seriously would release this as their introductory text. It felt like my old middle school friends and I decided to start a church and wrote a book. You may find a couple of interesting tidbits regarding the mythology of Lucifer but the mistakes make it so hard to read that it's not worth your trouble. I really hope that the GCOL at least invests in a decent editor for the next version of this book.

Luciferianism is a path that is syncretic in nature; it is based upon a conglomeration of numerous earlier philosophies and religions. These ideas from over the ages have been harvested for their usefulness and formed into a new essence, Luciferianism. Up until now one had to read numerous tomes in order to find the core essence, and in fact intensive study will always be part of the path, but still...something was needed. What was needed was a comprehensive yet concise explanation of the basics. Stripped down to plain language. This is a book that does just that. Ostensibly this book is an outline of the philosophy of the Greater Church of Lucifer, and how this is codified by Luciferianism. Given that the authors are not only founder Jacob No, but also noted Luciferian philosophers and writers Michael W. Ford, Jeremy Crow, and Hope Marie, this book is also an extremely comprehensive look at Luciferianism in general. Michael W. Ford is arguably the leading writer on Luciferianism, and is also the one who brought it to modern prominence. His research is known to be impeccable and it comes to bear in this work. So what of the book itself? It's a short yet dense little volume packed full of plain-language, demystified explanations of the philosophy of Luciferianism (specifically as codified by the Greater Church of Lucifer) in practical terms as well as an explanation of the lineage of the ideology. The historical antecedents of Luciferianism from the ancient world until now. This is done in a way that is not only graspable for someone completely

new to Luciferianism or the Left Hand Path, but will also make the longtime practitioner cheer that there is finally a book we can point to out there for people who ask us about what we believe and do. If you're looking for a concise, clear, plain language explanation of Luciferianism, in general, and a specific outline of the philosophy of The Greater Church of Lucifer, then look no further than this tome.
