

William Faulkner's short story "The Bear" was first published in the May 9, 1942 issue of *The Saturday Evening Post*. The piece, considered one of the best short stories of the twentieth century, is a coming-of-age tale that weaves together themes of family, race, and the taming of the wilderness, as the young main character learns to hunt and track the huge bear known as Old Ben. "Be scared. You can't help that. But don't be afraid. Ain't nothing in the woods going to hurt you unless you corner it, or it smells that you are afraid." This short work is part of Applewood's "American Roots" series, tactile mementos of American passions by some of America's most famous writers and thinkers.

Purchased this book for our March Men's Book Club. During the discussion we realized that this copy of *The Bear* is not the full original book. Don't buy it. Find another version and make sure it has all the narrative. I say AGAIN DON't BUY THIS BOOK.

Disappointed that it was an abridged version of the book. My fault though, I would have known if I had read the reviews. It would, however, have been very kind if it had been mentioned in the description.

Nice read

It's the short form, which is fine (there are actually 3 versions, including the original short story). The version in *Go Down, Moses* is difficult because of the additional section in which Ike dives into the family genealogy to repudiate it. Thus section, as Faulkner said, adds to the novel but detracts from the short story. Get *Three Famous Short Novels*.

It's not possible to tell if this is the full text of *The Bear* or the shortened form. If you want to be sure to get the full text then buy the kindle edition of *Go Down, Moses*. You do want to know if they get the bear, don't you?!
