

Bob Marley: Spirit Dancer



Synopsis

A photographic and textual meditation on the life of a legend, reissued in special CD-size format. Twenty years after Bob Marley's untimely death he remains a powerful worldwide presence. His music is at the top of the reggae charts, while his memory is indelibly etched in the minds of millions of his followers. In the last two years of his life Marley underwent a dramatic change, becoming a gentler and more philosophical version of himself. He also met photographer Bruce Talamon, to whom he granted unprecedented access, both on the stage and off. The result is this remarkable visual record, which, paired with Roger Steffens's sensitive text tracing Marley's life from his youth in Jamaica to worldwide acceptance, captures (in the words of the late Timothy White's introduction) "the private warmth, social equanimity, zealous determination...and personal magnetism" of Bob Marley. 82 b/w photographs

Steffens traces the life of well-known Rastafarian and Jamaican reggae performer Bob Marley (1945-81) from his youth to his worldwide acceptance to the months preceding his death from cancer at age 36. Bob Marley is not only an important cultural symbol. He is also something of a cottage industry. Sound recordings, videos, and desultory paraphernalia make of him, even in death, a potent and

profitable figure. This volume largely of portraits represents a maturing of the Marley market even as the fascination with all things Marley filters down to fans too young to have seen him alive. Tasteful and well done, Talamon's photographic essay stands in stark contrast to some of the raw, slapdash products intended primarily to cash in on Marley's fame. The photographs catch Marley in relaxed, even introspective moods, and Timothy White's lengthy foreword lays to rest some of the misunderstandings and errors in previous Marley studies. Moreover, this is a thoroughly entertaining book that captures the mystical mood of reggae and advances the study of a figure who, like Malcolm X, to whom Talamon compares him, has grown greatly in influence and stature since his death. This book was rated because of all the photos included, but who wants to see pictures in a 'book' that small? I'm sorry I took it out of the package because of curiosuty. I purchased this book for our high school library hoping to have at least one good introduction to Bob Marley for our students. While it will do the job, it's more of a photo-essay from the last two years of his life, accompanied by a biographical article that reads more like album liner notes.I was hoping for more description of the music, how it evolved, what it's about and how it was received. I was hoping for a more detailed chronology of his life, not just a recitation of names and

events. Having said that, this book is better than nothing to get our readers interested in Marley. It'll do.

Bob Marley is a legend, we all know that. As one African American, he had the power to change an entire country that was in the middle of a major dispute. I knew this information previously to reading this book. However, I didn't know nearly as much as I do now. I'm not going to give any information from the book, you can read it on your own, but I will tell you that for the small amount of pages this book has, there is still a ton of very good information and insight into Marley's life.
