


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The Montreal Plateau: A Traveler's Guide To The Essentials

Whenever I'm traveling to a new place I always try to pick up an insider's guide as I know I'll get the best view of a city from someone who knows it well. That's one of the reasons I really liked The Montreal Plateau - it gave me the opportunity to see the city through the eyes of a local. Like the author, I always go looking for a great cup of coffee when in a new city, and the books description of Le Fovrac put it at the top of my go-to list. It was also so cool to read about Le Plateau's bike-friendly and walk-friendly attitudes. Just wish more places within large cities were more like this. The author begins by mapping out the boundaries of Le Plateau as it sits within Montreal, then gives readers an overview of the language, culture and spirit of the area. Clearly more French than English, this neighborhood retains a charm that makes it (as the author says) more an experience than a venue. To be honest, prior to reading this book I hadn't really thought about going to Montreal, but Le Plateau is now enticing me to go north!

I realized this book covered just a single neighborhood, but even so, it is a very slim book with large type. Though it may have some useful info if you are spending your entire visit in this one neighborhood, I suspect you would find similar info online. Unfortunately, I am not finding any compelling pre-trip guides to Montreal beyond the standard formula publications.

Bought this as a gift for my niece who just moved to Montreal. I'm from the area and lived on the Plateau for several years, this book was okay but could have easily been more thorough.
