


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Discover The Secret Soul Of Chile: Valparaiso And Santiago...4 Magical Days At The Beginning Or End Of Your South American Cruise

Santiago is a different kind of experience. It’s a big (5 million) somewhat smoggy city with a view of the Andes and dozens of places to explore. Santiago was a 2012 Traveller’s Choice Award Winner and will likely be for 2013 as well, as more global travellers adventure to South America. Museums, markets, sculpture park, modern malls, cafes, dance clubs & there’s so much to see and do. Santiago has an excellent subway (metro) system that will transport you to most of the places you’ll want to visit. And the best shopping on your South American trip (if you’re looking for special Artisan’s work) is here at Los Dominicos Handicraft Market. Chile is fast becoming one of the most recognized wine producing countries in the world - second only to France at the recent September 2012 Decanter Worldwide Wine Awards in London, England. With over 14,000 wines in competition, only 28 wines received worldwide trophies & 5 of those international trophies went to Chilean wines. There are several vineyards between the two cities and you may want to extend your visit for an extra day to experience wine country - there are lots of options for tours, tastings, even accommodation at the vineyards. Have this e-book in your hand while you explore & so you don’t miss anything on your fun and instructive tours of Valparaiso and Santiago. Go home knowing you’ve seen two travel

In a relatively short book, the author have covered everything from the basics of local transportation, currency, language, etc. to a quick introduction to the hidden treasures of Valparaiso and Santiago. The use of photos and maps interspersed with personal anecdotes and recommendations made the experience more real for me. I really liked the use of imbedded links throughout the book. The details were available and helped to support the book without duplicating information available from other sources (which is always good). I've never traveled to South America but after reading this book I have a better understanding of what the experience could be. Well worth the price.

This book is too short. Author talks about how walking around the city is wonderful. However, there are no directions and walking tour suggestions. The book does not include any hotel or restaurant recommendations. It does not list museums and instead only list a couple.

Good list of Valparaiso & Santiago highlights. Lots of cruising info I didn't need. Ebook formatting leaves much to be desired. No maps, no links to metro or bus system, and I could only access the table of contents from the front of the book.

A worthwhile read before you go and a great reference guide while you are there. Easy, quick read with lots of interesting tidbits, facts and things to do in Santiago and Valparaiso. Have been there and wish I'd had this book with me at the time!
