


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# Mr. Nuts And Mr. Balls

Sorry, but this wasn't funny at all. I do have a sense of humor.... I love to watch funny movies & sitcoms, and am never offended by anything. I love everything from Seinfeld, to Jack Handy, and even love sitcoms with mature audience ratings, such as Sunny in Philadelphia. I also love good clean humor, I love old re-runs of Andy Griffith and Beverly Hillbillies. What I'm trying to say, is that I'm pretty easy to please when it comes to humor. When I saw this book for sale, I loved the title and thought it might be a good birthday gift for a friend of mine who loves off color humor. I thought I'd first get the digital copy and read it...if it was good I'd get the paperback copy for my friend. Long story short, I did NOT buy the paperback version. First of all, I read the book in one minute. Yep that's right, one minute. Although it might take a slow reader a couple of minutes to finish it, and maybe someone who is just learning to read may take 3 minutes. In the electronic version, there are 21 pages. Most pages consists of a simple one liner, although a few pages contain 2-3 whole sentences. The whole book, is basically a conversation between Mr. Nuts & Mr. Balls...they are debating which is better, nuts or balls. Spoiler alert....Quote from 2 pages of dialogue to follow: Mr. Balls says, "Hairy-schmary, they're boring (meaning nuts). Balls come in tons of colors. Nuts are always the same dull color: brown". Mr. Nuts retaliates by saying: "Nuts are brown because they come from the earth. They are natural and nutritious. Who doesn't like a nice, salty nut? That takes up two pages of the book, and they are among the wordiest of the pages. If you think those excerpts are funny, you may not feel too put out by paying \$2.99 for the digital copy. Even if you think it's hilarious though, I can't imagine anyone paying the paperback price of \$8.88 for a one to two minute book. I can see how the book might be a little humorous to maybe a pre-teen who is just starting to figure out the double meaning for the words 'balls' and 'nuts'... Maybe someone whose sense of humor is still at a really young stage. As far as being offensive, there is none of the promised offensiveness whatsoever. Unless you count the fact that I wasted \$2.99 on it. That might have

been the offensive part. Thankfully I didn't spend the \$8.88, which is the current price of the paperback version as of the time of this review. Bottom line, I did not find the book funny at all, and I was truly appalled that I'd spent anything over a penny on it. Also, I think the description should say that it is a SHORT book. It says '26' pages, and although that is indeed short, I at least expected some of pages to have multiple paragraphs. Instead, each page consists solely of a statement or a response from one of the characters, even if it's just a two or three word statement. You read the statement, then... Whoops, no more room after those whopping three words, better turn the page! I'm sorry to be so negative here. I am usually pretty positive and easy to please. If the digital price was maybe just .99, and the print price maybe under \$4-5, I would've probably been more generous. As it is, I definitely expected a better quality of humor and more content for the price.
