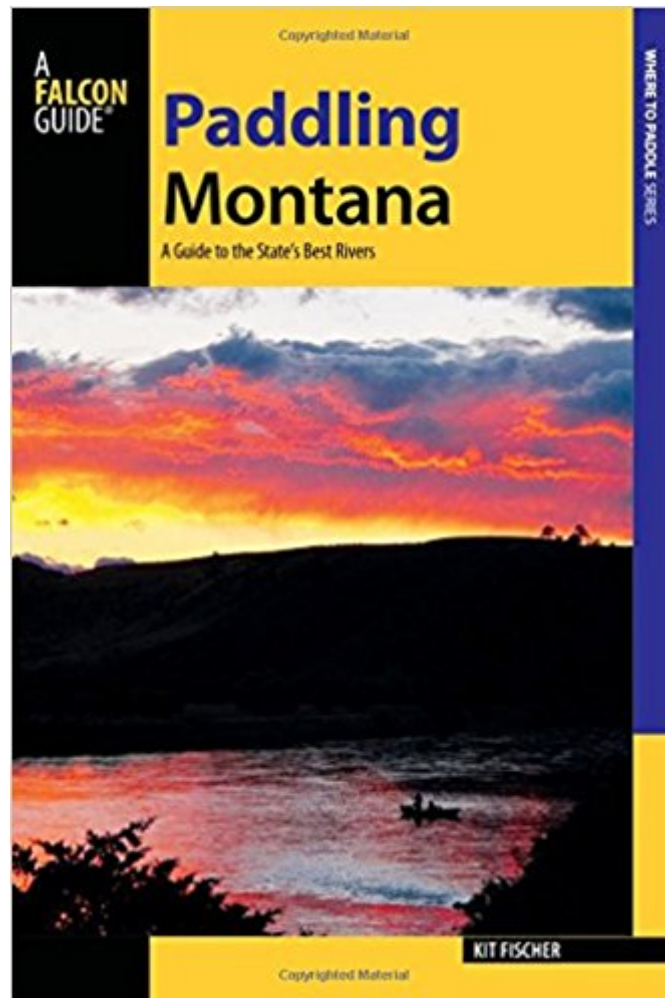




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Paddling Montana: A Guide To The State's Best Rivers (Paddling Series)
